During the past days other care facilities lost power for short periods c they made prompt notifications and put their emergency plans to affect so no other facilities in required evacuation. One Beverly resident is still hospitalized.

On July 23rd, St. Joseph`s Hospital in Stockton reported the death of a patient from the Beverl Convalescent Home admitted with heat-related symptoms. It was found that the Home's air coi had failed and all residents were evacuated to area hospitals and other care facilities.

On July 24th, the San Joaquin County Sheriff/Coroner reported that the morgue was full and re refrigeration facilities.

The cities of Lathrop and Lodi opened cooling centers for seniors beginnning on July 24th. Lodi Hospital specifically requested a cooling center be opened for the community due to suspected deaths and the number of patients in the ICU admitted due to heat-related causes.

On July 25th, the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors proclaimed a Local Emergency du unprecedented July heat experience over the past several days and its potential impact on the of humans, and the County's agricultural industry, including both livestock and produce.

A Disaster Relief Coalition of public and private non-profit agencies was formed to coordinate e operational area.

On July 25th, the SJ County Agricultural Commissioner estimated that 120 heifers per day wer addition to currently unknown numbers of turkeys and other livestock. Crop damages are expe to walnuts, grapes & tomatoes.

Power went out to two trailer parks overnight on July 25th for 3-4 hours.

Additional cooling centers have been opened throughout San Joaquin County. As of July 27th t cooling centers opened serving approximately 165 residents. In addition, shelters and commun
